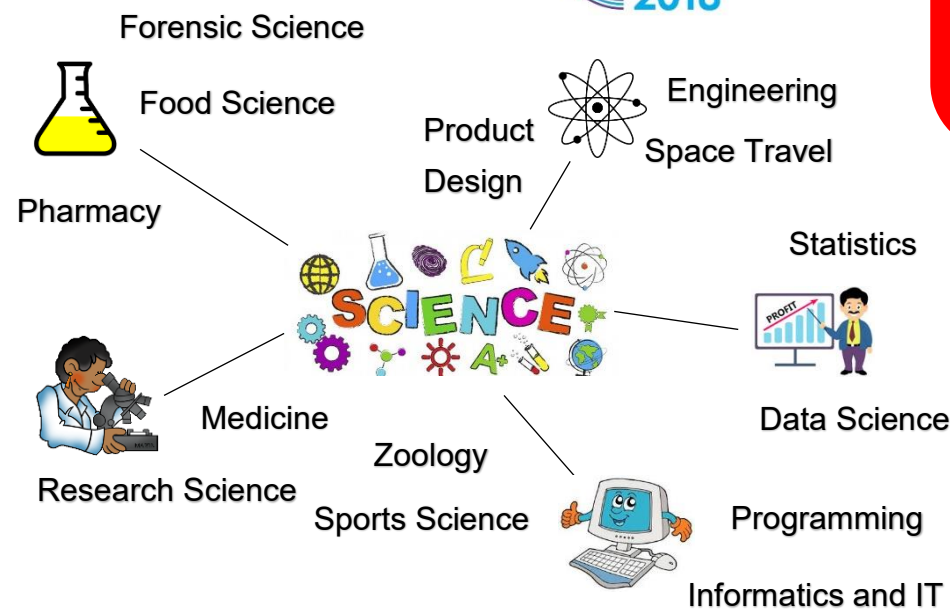

6th Form / College

Students studying Science at A-Level can choose between studying Physics, Chemistry and Biology (or all three) and colleges offer ways to study Science in alternative courses, such as BTEC Applied Science or BTEC Extended Diploma in Forensic Science.

University

According to **What Uni**, there are over 1500 individual university degrees related to Science in the UK, including everything from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Medicine, Dentistry, Forensic Science, Sports Science, Engineering and Computer Science, to name but a few!

Apprenticeships

There are apprenticeships related to Science in a wide variety of career areas at levels from Intermediate (L2) to Degree (L6), including Pharmacy Services, Aerospace Engineering and Nuclear Science!

British Science Week 2018!

As this week is British Science Week, Mrs. Malik and the Science department have a series of form-time activities and lessons planned, including a whole-school poster competition! Here are the details of how students can take part:

The requirement of the poster is as follows:

1. A single side of A4
2. A great discovery/exploration in Science e.g. discovery of Penicillin
3. Details about the discovery e.g., **Who? When? Where? How?**
4. **Closing date: Thursday 15th March**



HOUSE POINTS are also up for grabs! Each year group will be awarded **1st, 2nd** and **3rd** place and the following house points:

- 1st place** - 100 points
- 2nd place** - 75 points
- 3rd place** - 50 points



10 house points are also awarded for taking part!

The 5 best posters from year 7/8/9 will be submitted for a national competition run by the British Science Association
